

Relocation of Divisional Office

The Court anticipates that on or before **March 1, 2022**, we will complete the move of our divisional office, currently located in Spartanburg, to the Clement F. Haynsworth Federal Building and U.S. Courthouse in Greenville. Bankruptcy facilities there include offices for clerk's office staff, a courtroom, two conference rooms, a public access terminal, and offices for a resident judge and chambers staff. Parking is available in parking decks located on the blocks surrounding the Haynsworth Building, as well as limited on-street parking. Court staff, phone numbers, email addresses, and the address for mailing documents to the Court will not change. (Documents should be mailed to: U.S. Bankruptcy Court, 1100 Laurel Street, Columbia, SC 29201. Attorneys must file documents electronically pursuant to SC LBR 5005-4.)

Hearings Before a Bankruptcy Judge

Beginning March 1, 2022, in-person hearings in this division will be held on the first floor, 300 East Washington Street, Greenville, SC 29601. Should any hearing notice for matters scheduled to be heard in the division after that date include the Spartanburg address, parties should assume the hearing will be held in Greenville. As hearing dates approach and unresolved matters are identified that require hearings, the Court will take additional steps to ensure the parties are aware of the new hearing location.

Beginning February 7, 2022, all new Hearing Notices generated by attorneys (Self-Scheduling Pursuant to SC LBR 9013-4) that schedule a hearing on or after March 1, 2022, shall substitute the following hearing location in place of Spartanburg:

First Meetings of Creditors pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 341

The Office of the United States Trustee controls the scheduling and location of these meetings. While the Greenville address may appear in place of Spartanburg on future § 341 meeting notices, meetings are currently held virtually and, absent further notice, this address change does not alter current practices.
