THIS MATTER comes before the Court by way of an Order entered May 5, 2003, requiring James W. Workman ("Workman"), the attorney for Robbie J. Griffin ("Debtor") to appear regarding his failure to properly prepare and prosecute the Motion to Avoid Judicial Liens ("Lien Avoidance Motion") filed on April 1, 2003.

The Court finds that the Lien Avoidance Motion and proposed Order fail to comply with South Carolina Local Rule 4003-1 and Local Official Forms 4003-1 and fail to include information essential to the consideration of the Motion. Furthermore, the Lien Avoidance Motion appears improper in as much as Debtor owns no real property, so there can be no judicial lien on real property.

The Court also notes that the problems associated with the Lien Avoidance Motion frequently and repeatedly occur in motions of this type filed by Workman and that he has been repeatedly advised of such problems and deficiencies by the Court causing a drain on the Court's resources. Therefore, it is

ORDERED, that the Lien Avoidance Motion filed on April 1, 2003 is denied without prejudice to the refiling of a correct motion and proposed order within ten (10) days. Upon failure to meet that deadline, such a motion is barred.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Workman is hereby cautioned to ensure compliance with the above stated Local Rule and Forms in all future cases or be subject to sanctions.

AND IT IS SO ORDERED.
